

The Street Appeal Thursday 24th September



Thank you, Professor Kevin Pringle Paediatric Surgeon Extraordinaire Retires



The Foundation wishes to thank Professor Kevin Pringle for nearly 30 years of service in New Zealand as a Paediatric surgeon. Bringing his family with him to New Zealand from his home in the USA, Professor Pringle was, at the time, the only Paediatric surgeon south of Taupo. Things have improved since then with five Paediatric surgeons in Wellington.

During his time here he has earned the respect and love of his patients, their families, and his colleagues who know him as a surgeon who would go to any lengths to improve the care of his patients. **DID YOU KNOW?**

Last year many young people were patients at Wellington Children's Hospital. For kids aged 0–16 years there were:

- Emergency dept. visits 10,253
- Outpatient visits 27,696
- Admissions to wards 6,702
- Babies born 3,740
- Neonatal babies 853
- Paediatric surgery 1,815
- Radiology procedures 13,022



Professor Pringle has fond memories of his time in theatre and the neonatal unit, particularly the teamwork. But it is the patients that he will miss the most:

"...watching [the kids] who were really sick as neonates growing up into healthy teenagers...I've had cases where I've treated first the mother and then later the daughter, seeing them both grow up and lead happy lives."

A modest man he dislikes too many public accolades, but justifiably deserves mention as a founding member of the International Fetal Medicine and Surgery Society. He is also one of only four people to have received a lifetime

The generosity of these two organisations means snug, warm patients. It also allows others to share their skills and caring through volunteering as knitters of the wool these two organisations have provided.

Wellington Hospital goes **Biodegradable with Hospi Cups**

After many years Wellington Hospital's polystyrene drinking cups are on the way out. New biodegradable "Hospi" Cups are now being distributed throughout the hospital for patient and staff use thanks to a partnership between Wellington Hospitals Foundation and CCDHB. Wellington Hospital uses almost 2 million drinking cups each year so this will be a significant change.

The Chair of Capital Coast District Health Board's Sustainability Committee, Andrea McCance said of the cups introduction "It has been our dream for a number of years to be able to provide biodegradable cups as our way of extending our environmentally friendly focus. But costs have always made this prohibitive. Now with the support of the Foundation we have been able to make this a reality." Bill Day, Chair Wellington Hospitals Foundation, said that this was a good use

of funds generated through the Foundations Hospital Gift Shop which benefits patients and the environment. "Hospi is the Foundation's official mascot for Children's Hospital and gives us the opportunity to extend Hospi's profile not only with sick children but also the thousands of adult patients that the hardworking hospital staff attend to each day. It's just a small thing but means so much".

How your donations are making a difference: Portable Ultrasound Makes Wellington **Emergency Department** A First In New Zealand

Thanks to a generous grant from Pub Charity, the Foundation have been able to purchase a Portable Ultrasound machine for the Emergency Department at Wellington Regional Hospital. Portable ultrasound is the new stethoscope and far more accurate and versatile in properly trained hands. As the machines have grown smaller and the technology more sophisticated, staff are now able to visualise almost every organ in the human body, without the dangers of harmful radiation. In addition, staff can now do this instantly at the patient's bedside. Dr Andre Cromhout said that "Ultrasound helps cut through the uncertainty, rule-out highly critical diagnosis and save precious minutes in true emergencies. Whether the potential problem is heart and lung disease, an abdominal aneurysm, an ectopic pregnancy, internal bleeding from trauma, blood clots, stones, infections, retinal detachments, or dozens of other conditions, staff can instantly identify who needs emergency intervention and promptly get them the care that they need".

In addition, staff will use the ultrasound multiple times every day to help guide invasive procedures such as nerve blocks and IV placement that had previously been done with needle-sticks, saving time

and minimising pain.
